TSA Independent Schools offer a range of support in transitioning programs, Tafe in Schools, in school apprenticeships with external providers as well as class subjects and in school certificates.


Much preparation went into making the fundraising part of this event such a success. There was a sausage sizzle, loaded hotdogs, cakes, cheesecakes, and coffee.
