



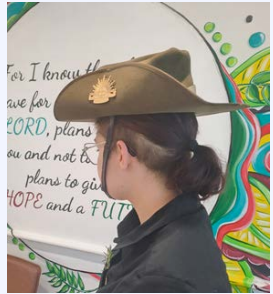

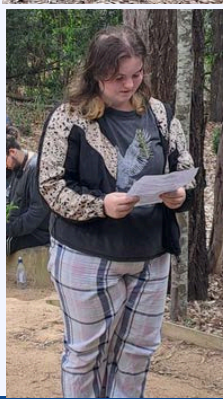
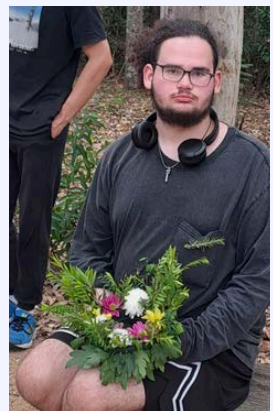
Anzac Day Service
